# TOLLING OF THE BELL

Christ Candle departs the darkened sanctuary. Congregation is invited to exit in silence.

#### What is Tenebrae?

The word "Tenebrae," means darkness. The service, which is very ancient, dramatically symbolizes the final hours of Christ's life.

Tenebrae traditions vary. Since the late Middle Ages, the only light during most of the service was derived from a set of 15 candles. These candles were extinguished one by one at the conclusion of the reading of a Psalm. The service concluded with Psalm 51, recited in complete darkness. Another tradition included tolling a bell for each year of Jesus' life.

In our service this evening, we shall extinguish seven candles, each one following a reading from a passion narrative and the singing of a hymn or choral anthem. The narratives begin with the last supper and conclude with Jesus being led to the cross.

After the seventh candle has been extinguished, the church will be darkened. The Christ candle, on the Communion Table, will be removed from the sanctuary. A bell will be tolled seven times, reminding us of the seven scenes leading to the crucifixion.
